### From the Rector

Dear Friends,  
Many moons ago I confided in a priest that I was feeling the stirrings of vocation within me. I found it difficult to describe but what I did know was that it was insistent and until I somehow resolved it within me it was not going to go away. This particular priest was an academic, a musician, a liturgist, a historian, an art curator, an author, a true polymath... I was a postman!

He listened to my ramblings and asked if I had read any poetry by Francis Thompson. I hadn't, indeed I had never even heard of him. Try this he said handing me a booklet, I can't read it without tears: *The Hound of Heaven*. I read the poem that afternoon and I understood his reaction. Here's the first stanza:

I fled Him, down the nights and down the days;  
I fled Him, down the arches of the years;  
I fled Him, down the labyrinthine ways  
Of my own mind; and in the midst of tears  
I hid from Him, and under running laughter.  
Up vistaed hopes I sped;  
And shot, precipitated,  
Adown Titanic glooms of chasmed fears,  
From those strong Feet that followed, followed after.  
But with unhurrying chase,  
And unperturbed pace,  
Deliberate speed, majestic instancy,

They beat - and a Voice beat

More instant than the Feet -  
'All things betray thee, who betrayest Me'.

That evening I served at the altar. It was a short said Eucharist never well attended, a prelude to Evensong. The first reader failed to materialise so I went to the lectern. I had no idea what I would be reading. I prayed it didn't have any long names...and I read from Isaiah chapter six: 'In the year King Uzziah died,' the reading ended 'here am I; send me.' We will hear that reading today and coupled with the call of the fishermen in the gospel, it evokes in me memories of the call of the reluctant postman! I hope and pray that we can all perceive within ourselves that sense of being called and respond, albeit perhaps reluctantly like Isaiah and Simon Peter.

The current Parish Council met for the last time during the week. Tim Gulliver and Leighton Mann are stepping aside after many years sterling service. We as a parish owe them both a debt of gratitude and we look forward to their continued contribution to parish life in different ways, thank you both.
