From the Rector

Dear friends,

Since I penned my last Pew Sheet missive much has happened. On two very different occasions we opened the doors of St Philip's and welcomed folk in to our midst, first for the Spring Fling and then for Pat's funeral. Each in their own way were celebrations of life. It is right and natural that we mourn the passing of our friends, in the beatitudes we hear 'Blessed are they who mourn, for they will be comforted.' Paul tells the Romans to 'Rejoice with those who rejoice and mourn with those who mourn.' In the very earliest of New Testament writings in Paul's first letter to the Thessalonians he writes we should 'not grieve as others do who have no hope.' As we grieved we also celebrated the hope that is ours. Both gatherings demonstrated our commitment to life in its fullest, and I hope that those who came among us felt something of that infectious spirit, the spirit of faith, hope and love. Many of you helped during this busy time and many appreciated the hospitality that was offered. Thank you to you all.

Our gospel passage this morning concludes with one of those short pithy sentences that have found their way into our vernacular. It is perhaps better in the old language: You cannot serve both God and Mammon. Clearly in our time debt is an issue and will prove the undoing of many. The biblical scholar NT Wright wrote this a while ago, which still resonates today:

T.S. Eliot asked, fifty-five years ago, whether our modern Western society was founded in fact on anything other than the principle of compound interest; it is a question that looks to me even more urgent today. We live in a society where debt, which used to be regarded as somewhat sordid and shameful, is glitzy and glamorous, with advertisements telling us that when you own a Mastercard 'You've got the whole world in your hands', or alternatively that Visa 'makes the world go round'. Both of them make

claims for Mammon which, at the theoretical level, conflict directly with the claims of Jesus, and which, in practice, are very obviously lies; and yet millions believe them, and live by them. At the global level, the problem of debt is notorious and acute, creating misery for millions while it generates millions for a tiny minority. ... I fail to see why the churches as a whole could not, as a matter of preaching the gospel of the crucified and risen Jesus, join together in naming the idol Mammon for what he is, and celebrating the love of God in Christ in his place."

Next week I am taking some annual leave. Susan and I are heading to Melbourne to visit family and friends. Next Sunday The Rev'd Sarah Gibson will be preaching. Sarah is a senior Army Chaplain working alongside health professionals in welfare policy making. Sarah is to be licensed to the parish and will be coming among us when she is in Canberra. Sarah and her husband Tom have three children Hamish, Sophie, and Bethany. The two girls are preparing for Confirmation and will be presented to Bishop Mark when he visits the parish next month. We are very much looking forward to celebrating with them. Please contact one of the Churchwardens if you are in need of ministry or have any other parish matters that need attending to. Thank you.
