From the Locum Rector

Dear Friends.

We begin our second week of Advent in the first chapter of Mark's Gospel with John the Baptist preparing the way.

There was something about John which brought crowds of people flocking to him. Something about his urgency and his purpose, and perhaps something in their longing for an answer which drew them to him. John was keen to point out that he was just the forerunner, the bringer of a message. The one they are waiting for is yet to come and his significance beyond understanding.

In Advent, we focus on our collective longing as a church waiting for Jesus to return. This annual season of waiting is one of many Advent seasons across the span of our lives, and many many more across the millennia of a waiting church. In this longer Advent each of us is a forerunner, called to bring the same message as John, carrying forward the faith we celebrate in the second Advent candle. John's urgency offers a reminder of the responsibility of faith.

Is there something in your own urgency and purpose drawing those around you towards the good news of the story of Jesus this Christmas?
