## From the Locum Rector

What is Christmas all about?

Christmas is a significant event for all Australians, whether they believe in Christ or not. Most of us look forward to a season which coincides with summer holidays, new year, and the annual gathering of extended family. We must also remember that for many it is a reminder of loss.

Much of Christmas is all about tradition, from church and carols to feasting and cult movies. The Muppet Christmas Carol is traditional viewing in our house. Christian and non-Christian alike all welcome seasonal traditions as something certain and grounding in a constantly changing world.

Beyond the traditions, the spiritual essence of Christmas is grounded in what happened one night in Bethlehem a long time ago. When a young woman, far from home, soon to be a refugee, gave birth to a child who would change the world. It is grounded in faith and hope, and its focus is on the most basic claim that Christianity makes, namely that Jesus Christ is the eternal God who "became flesh and lived among us so that we could see the glory of God, full of grace and truth" (Jn 1:14).

We look forward to the traditions and family feasts because they bring us together. Jesus was always inviting people to have meals with him. Christmas is a time when we celebrate the 'togetherness' of man and God united in one person. Those words hope, peace, joy, love – universal sentiments of Christmas to both Christian and non-Christian - are the basis of our faith. The challenge of faith is that these become a tradition part of every day and every season.
