Parish Council Key Points—August 2024

- A work, health and safety audit was completed on 13 July: no major issues were identified. Council decided to purchase a defibrillator, which will be maintained by St John's Ambulance alongside the replenishment of the first aid boxes. We now have a step ladder to aid posting of the hymn numbers.
- A building inspection report by the diocesan Director of Asset Management found recommended actions also to be relatively minor, focusing on good ventilation and keeping vegetation away from buildings.
- We expect discussions with the kindergarten to be concluded soon with a view to renewing its occupancy licence for a further five years.
- The Council especially thanks Ian Cousins for much regular and detailed work on the gardens. We also thank Pandora's for a financial contribution toward maintenance and electricity costs.

Demystifying Safe Ministry Training

Safe Ministry Training happens at three levels.

Level 1 is **essential** for every “church worker.” It includes almost everyone with some kind of up-front participation in worship—as well as anyone in a leadership role or who encounters people as part of ministry. *Level 2* concerns people working with children and young people. *Level 3* is for clergy, parish councillors and other parish leaders and coordinators. Each course is conducted through a face-to-face workshop of 2 hours, or a Zoom session of 2 hours, or online via Openlearning.com.

Level 1

Module 1: Safe Ministry Essentials — For **all** church workers: awareness of the safe ministry policy and procedures; biblical foundations; healthy team ministry; screening; boundaries; code of conduct; duty of care; responding to concerns; and self-care as church workers.

Module 3: Safe Ministry refresher (every 3 years) — refreshes and updates Safe Ministry Essentials.

Level 2

Module 2: Safe Ministry with Children and Young People—For child and youth workers.
