No Sense of Entitlement Book Launch

On Thursday 21^{st} March from 6-8pm, St Mark's Library will be hosting an event to celebrate the release of feminist theologian Dr Heather Thomson's important new book.

About the Book:

How might we keep alive the interests and concerns of protest theologies and the constructive contributions they make? Feminist, liberation, and postcolonial theologies offer guiding questions for this task:

What is the purpose of theology?

Whose interests are being served?

What might be the public effects of this theology?

This book attends to these questions through a collection of publications over the lifetime of one feminist theologian. Growing up in Australia as these new protest theologies were emerging, Thomson recalls the influences that went into forming her as the theologian she became.
