From the locum Rector

Generosity

"A generous person will be enriched; one who gives refreshment will be refreshed." Proverbs 11.25.

"Those who are kind to kind to the needy honour God" Prov. 14:31.

When we think of generosity, we immediately think of giving money. This is important. But I'd like us to think of the generosity of heart that is willing to give time. In our current society, to be generous with money seems to be held as some sort of virtue. However, society needs those who are not so busy with their own stuff to be willing to generously give of their time for the benefit of others. How would our society get on without the contribution of volunteers: fire fighters, surf life savers, SES, RSPCA, etc. etc?
