Dear friends,

Returning from holidays is accompanied with a mixture of feelings! The sense of relief and gratitude at returning home is mixed with a desire to prolong the enjoyment of the holiday experience! I had a great time travelling, seeing places, meeting people and catching up with relatives in England but it is good to be back with Jane, Gareth and John and the normal routine of St Philip's again.

Thanks to the Wardens and Jeannette McHugh and all who kept St Philip's humming along in my absence! Having said that they are all the same people who keep St Philip 's humming along when I am here. with help from God of course!

While thinking about my travels I must say how I loved Switzerland, from the quiet speed and efficiency of the rail system to the sheer beauty of the landscape, the cleanliness and order as well as the cheese, chocolate, coffee and icecream! (the important things of life!) While in Switzerland John and I stayed with Stefan and Myriam Schlapfer in Lenzburg and went to their daughter Anina's wedding to Lars Jaggi. Well, we went to the Christian ceremony which followed the civil declaration of their marriage. It was a wonderful week in which we got to see around Lenzburg, Zurich, Berne, Luzern, Baden and St Moritz as well as plenty of wonderful places in between.

Our Eurail passes took us on to Milan in Italy where we looked around the Duomo. the castle and the city before travelling to Decenzano and Lago de Garda (Lake Garda). On the only really rainy day of our stay in Europe we saw the sights from the ferry before alighting in Salo and then travelling back to the train to dry off.

We then flew to Heathrow where John travelled home and I went to stay

with my mother's cousin Margaret and her husband Peter Ash. Sadly Margaret 's brother John had died a day or so earlier and my first task was to attend his funeral. As is usual funerals bring families together and I was able to meet another cousin Alan Battersby and his sons Richard and David. Had it not been for the funeral I might not have had the chance to catch up with them.

While staying with Margaret and Peter I managed to visit Windsor Castle and the Windsor Farm Shop, travelled to Wealdstone to see Carolyn Forbes before visiting York and Cambridge. We also visited my cousin Sue with husband Paul and sons Daniel Andrew and Stephen in Chesham and the following week travelled to Easebourne (pronounced Ezbourne) where cousin Gillian's husband Derek is the Vicar. We stayed in the priory with them and daughters Jennifer and Abigail and experienced a Baptism and Eucharist at St Mary's. (The preacher quoted a Michael Leunig prayer.) I was most impressed that the list of clergy in the parish starts at 1276 and Elizabeth I actually stayed there in the priory!

Amongst all the wonderful places the most enriching thing was to share the lives of those amongst whom we stayed and to experience the diversity of their faith. All the people I have mentioned are active practising Christians of various backgrounds. It was great to hear their stories and their struggles and to worship with them in a diversity of Churches.
