From the Rector

Dear Friends

Our gospel passage this week (Mark 10:17-31) is one that has the potential for us to consider closely the stewardship of our personal resources. The story of the rich young man is recounted in all three of the Synoptic Gospels – Matthew, Mark and Luke. In Mark it is a vivid account, clearly the young fellow who approaches Jesus is an endearing and engaging chap, there is no one else in Mark's gospel who we are told Jesus loved. But there is also no one else who leaves Jesus side saddened by the experience. Clearly his wealth was a stumbling block to his following Jesus.

We are entering into a busy time in the parish as we approach year's end. Our minds will be turning to end of year events, Christmas, holidays etc it is a time when perhaps more than ever we should intentionally turn our hearts and minds beyond ourselves and our immediate concerns to those for whom we have a special care. We as a parish have committed ourselves to supporting the work of St John's Care, a joint venture between the parish of St John's and Anglicare. This year Anglicare Sunday falls on 21st October to mark the end of Anti-Poverty Week – it is the perfect time to find out about what is being done to help vulnerable individuals and families. We are also in the throes of our international mission supporting an ABM project in Myanmar.

These outreach projects form an intrinsic part of our calling to be a people who are engaged in the ministry of healing. The Christian Medical Commission of the World Council of Churches adopted this definition which is worth considering:

Health is a dynamic state of well-being of the individual and society, of physical, mental, spiritual, economic, political and social well-being; of being in harmony with each other, with the material environment and with God.

In the New Testament healing is intimately linked with relationship. Indeed the words that are used in Jesus' ministry translate to health, wholeness (Holiness) and salvation –

it is our core business! To this end this Thursday, 18th October at 7.00pm, we will celebrate the feast of St Luke the Physician with a Eucharist and liturgy of healing. Our musicians have been preparing and will be offering music to engage and challenge us as we consider healing in all its dimensions. A light supper will follow the service, I hope that you can be there.
