From the Rector

Dear Friends,

Homelessness is an ever present reality for many in Canberra as it is in many other cities of the world. It is an intractable problem that we seem to be unable to address. A computer search of 'Homelessness in Australia' reveals endless websites, they largely say the same thing. Our understanding of homelessness is generally that of an older person, usually a male wheeling their belongings around and sleeping rough. However this is but the tip of the iceberg. Many younger folk are living in crowded accommodation, some are 'couch surfing,' living in vehicles or caravans.

In today's gospel Jesus describes himself as having 'nowhere to lay his head.' The comment is made in the context of the beginning of a journey, a journey to Jerusalem and the fulfilment of his life and mission. He asks those will travel with him to sit lightly with those things that will distract them

on the way, the ties of family and property. This is to some extent the call to us all, travel light and consider the goal of human life – the Kingdom of God.

This is a call that we choose, Jesus never forced his followers to adopt a particular way or lifestyle he merely encouraged them to follow him. It is true that some folk choose to live a particular way - we have a great tradition of the 'Swaggie' in our country, but the vast majority do not. We can offer a night's accommodation, a hot meal, this is crucially important but this is merely dealing with the immediate issue not the root cause. The issue of homelessness is a complex one.

Our support of St John's Care is important because the professionals there, supported by Anglicare, endeavour to deal with the immediate crisis, but also to assist in the root cause, whether it is domestic violence, addiction, mental health or whatever. Can I encourage you to continue to support this initiative particularly during these winter months, because by assisting in crisis care we are providing the opportunity for a more holistic response. It is also an opportunity for us to travel a little lighter and in doing so enable others to thrive rather than merely survive and to be able to look further ahead than the next meal or night.

Bishop Mark will be coming to Parish on Sunday 20th October for the 10.00am Eucharist and to Confirm and Receive folk into the Church. Please put this date in your diary now and nearer the time we can prepare and plan our celebration. We look forward to his first visit since his installation.
